GIRL-LED ACTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE

Following the successful launch of the Girl Led to Action on Climate Change (GLACC) Phase One report, the much-anticipated Phase Two has now commenced with a groundbreaking co-creation workshop organized by the Tanzanian Girl Guides Association (TGGA) uniting Girl Guides from eight regions spanning Tanzania's Mainland and Island.
